1. A person whose enduring romantic, emotional and/or physical attraction is exclusively or predominantly to the opposite sex.
2. A person whose enduring romantic, emotional and/or physical attraction is to both sexes.
3. A person who does not experience sexual attraction, but has emotional and romantic needs and can form intimate relations.
4. A woman whose enduring romantic, emotional and/or physical attraction is to other women.
5. A person who predominantly or entirely has romantic, emotional and/or physical attraction to people of the same sex or gender. In English, this is considered an outdated clinical term.
6. A term generally used to describe a man whose enduring romantic, emotional and/or physical attraction is to other men, although it can also be used to describe women who are attracted to other women.
7. An abbreviation for Men who have Sex with Men, the term is used mostly in HIV/AIDS prevention. The term is very inclusive – it includes all men (gay, bisexual, heterosexual, trans or intersex) who have sex with men.
8. A term that is inclusive of all people who are not heterosexual, including lesbians, gay men, bisexuals and transgender people. For some, the term has negative connotations, as it was traditionally an abusive term. Many sexual minorities have reclaimed it as a symbol of pride.
9. A person born with physical, hormonal or genetic features that are not fully female or male, or are a combination.
10. An umbrella term for people whose gender identity and/or expression differs from the sex assigned at birth.
11. A term referring to people whose gender identity and gender expression match the sex they were assigned at birth and the social expectations related to their gender.
